Important PSAT Information

PSATs are being administered to **tenth and eleventh grade students** from **8:15 – 11:50 a.m.** on **Wednesday, October 17.** At the conclusion of the test, students will report to their third period class. Proctors are asked not to release any students earlier than 11:50 a.m.

All other students are to report at 9 a.m. as follows:

9th graders:

9:00 – 11:50 - Freshmen HIV/AIDS Prevention Instruction: All 9th graders report to the Concert Hall
12:00 - Report to third period class

12th graders:

9:00 – 11:50 - Senior Class Trip to Central Park (Yearbook Photo)
12:00 - Report to third period class

No Cell Phones at PSAT

PSAT Lateness Policy

10th and 11th graders should arrive to school for the PSAT no later than 8:00 a.m.

If a student comes after the test has begun but before 9:15 a.m., he/she must go to the library and take the test there. Students who arrive after 9:15 will not be permitted to take the exam.



Extended Time Students

A student qualifies for extended time on the PSAT Examination if the College Board has confirmed his or her eligibility. Letters will be mailed home for students who are approved by the Board.

Updated Grading Policies for Fall 2012

Class grades are calculated according to the departmental grading policies that were established in September.

The following numeric grades may be assigned: **passing: 65-100 in increments of 1, failing: 55 or 60, and medically excused/no credit: 7.**

The following interim grades may be entered but must eventually be changed to a numeric grade on the student's transcript in order for the student to be awarded class credit:

New or recently arrived students: Students who enroll in a course after it has started may have missed assignments or assessments needed to generate a complete course grade for a given marking period. These students may be given a grade of **LN** but must complete the remaining course requirements by the end of the semester following the termination of the course in order to receive a final grade and credit, as applicable.

No show: A grade of **NS** is given to a student who fails to attend a course and does not participate in any of the work from which a grade can be derived. NS has a pass/fail equivalent of fail and a default numeric equivalent of 45.

The following grades will be assigned in physical education classes only: passing: S and failing: U.

Grades are due by **9 a.m.** on **Monday, October 22.**

Revised grades are due by **12 p.m.** on **Tuesday, October 23.**
