DO

- ...give grades in increments of five unless you are giving a grade between 90 and 100 or an 88.
- ...submit your grades on time! Otherwise, you may not be able to make corrections before report cards are printed.

DON'T

- ...forget to select "Save Target As" after rightclicking on the attachment in your e-mail.
- ... give any grade lower than a 40. The only exception to this rule is if you teach physical education, drama, or dance and are giving a 9 to a medically excused student.
- ... change the name of the original file in any way. The correct format is 2011_1_1_LASTNAME.



Forgetting to bubble a student as absent limits our efforts to identify and track students with attendance problems. Remember that you must fully bubble "attendance taken" as well as the students who are absent that day. The scanner will not read the Scantron unless this action is complete.

DonorsChoose Opportunities

Here is a summary of the current grants available on **DonorsChoose.org**:

Matching grant for teachers who are members of NEA (max \$500, supplies).

Music projects by a teacher who has never been funded before, max \$400 (funded by BING).

Health and Sports - There are two different grants available for gym projects right now; for one of them, you must select "gym and fitness" for the project subject. Examples include sports equipment or something to do with health, such as a vacuum cleaner to clean a rug, or a supply of hand sanitizer.

Healthy eating - These can be materials for a lesson on healthy eating, or a refrigerator to store snacks. FEED USA must appear in the project description.

Prevention of Bullying - These include books and supplies dealing with bullying. Include some copies of the Townsend Press book *Bullying in Schools*, and they will cover all but \$100 of your project (Townsend Press).

Field trips - Only a teacher who has used DonorsChoose before and has at least 6 points accumulated can apply for this. Perhaps departments that have a field trip planned can coordinate posting a project with a teacher who has enough points. The instructions for applying for a field trip can be found at **LaProgram.org**. The trip needs to be planned in advance. The date of the field trip needs to be at least 2 months after the date you are filing the application.

Here is a list of the teachers who have done the most projects on DonorsChoose and therefore are most likely to have enough points for a special request: Ms Healy , Ms Washburn, Ms. Pace McGoey, Mrs. Lytle, Mr Hoffner, Mrs Bodha, Mr. Fransowie, Ms Fischer , and Mr. Bar-Lev.

New IEP Form and Information Sessions

The State developed a new electronic form to help IEP teams focus on services that are most important for your child and to reduce variation of IEP forms across the state. The expectation is that IEPs will be more individualized to each student while at the same time held to the same standards across New York State.

Information sessions on the new IEP are being offered this month. You may visit the following Web page or LaProgram.org to learn more about the new IEP form.

Some differences between the previous form and the new one follow:

- The IEP is now electronic (created using a secure Web-based case management system), and the pages will flow, leaving as much room as needed to fill out each section.
- The new IEP should flow more logically beginning with levels of student performance, then the identification of goals, followed by recommendations on how to assist the student in achieving these goals, and finally the identification of the least restrictive environment where the student will achieve success.


More and more students are interested in ACT. Please see the Program Office Web site at LaProgram.org for more information.

Please be aware that parents of students with disabilities may be able to request extended time on national testing or special testing. In order to qualify, a student must have a professionally diagnosed condition, have appropriate documentation on file at school, and receive extended time for test in school due to disability. Any interested parent should review the ACT

Test Accommodations for Students with Disabilities document. View this document at LaProgram.org; it explains the forms and documents that must be submitted; the test dates, deadlines, and retest restriction; the test location and supervisor qualifications; and ways of contacting ACT through phone, mail, Web site, and

Extended Testing Time for Students



Extended time forms must be handed in to the school every year. Any parent who has submitted paperwork for extended testing time (504) should receive a response from the school by mail. To apply, a parent must submit the 504 application as soon as possible. The form can be found online at LaProgram.org. Contact Ms. van Keulen at 212-496-0700 x2261 for more information.

The College Board and the ACT are private companies with its their own review boards. The application form for The College Board and the ACT are different from the one for LaGuardia Arts High School. If your child intends to request extended time for either test, you must apply to them individually. Please contact Ms. Arezzi for more information at (212) 496-0700 x4235.

Please be aware that The College Board and the ACT application for extended time ask the school if the student uses all of the accommodations approved by LaGuardia in his or her 504. As a result of this inquiry, starting in September, the school will monitor the extent to which students use the accommodations, with particular attention paid to extended time.

For the 2011-12 school year, therefore, if it has been determined that you are entitled to extra time, we encourage you to take advantage of this provision on all classroom tests, standardized tests, midterm examinations, and final examinations. If you do not, you may not be granted extended time by The College Board and The ACT.
