
Thank you for submitting grades in a timely fashion this week. Students and parents appreciate your efforts. Accurate Attendance

Fall Mini-grants

BE SURE TO REMEMBER THE 4S's OF FIRE DRILLS: SPEED, SAFETY, SILENCE, and SERIOUSNESS

TEACHERS(CONTINUED)

a) We will be following the same fire drill route as last year. Those classes exiting by 65th street including those leaving through the back lobby will first walk up to Amsterdam Ave, cross 65th St. and circle around MLK until reaching West End Avenue. Those exiting the building on 64th St. will walk up to Amsterdam Ave and then cross 64th street and move downtown towards 62nd St.

It is imperative that ALL STAFF MEMBERS b) PARTICIPATE actively IN the EVACUATION OF the BUILDING and fully understands their role during an emergency situation.

In addition, it is important that teachers c) **REVIEW the following EMERGENCY PROCEDURES** WITH ALL of their STUDENTS, especially our freshmen who may not be familiar with the expectations and physical layout of the school and the surrounding area.

d) The PRINTED FIRE DRILL DIAGRAM placed IN EACH ROOM indicates the route to be followed. You should FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF AND YOUR STUDENTS WITH the floor EXITS and the EXIT ROUTES, which you are to take in case of an emergency.

The official FIRE DRILL SIGNAL is A SERIES e) OF (3) GONGS sounded FOUR TIMES (3-3-3-3). Disregard incomplete sequences.

In the case of a FALSE ALARM, an f) ANNOUNCEMENT will be MADE TO "DISREGARD THE BELLS." If a FIRE or SMOKE condition persists, The PA ANNOUNCEMENT will direct you TO EVACUATE the BUILDING.

As soon as the GONGS begin to RING g) STUDENTS ARE to be instructed to remain SILENT. PRIOR TO LEAVING THE CLASSROOM, THE TEACHER SHOULD STRESS THE SERIOUSNESS OF A FIRE DRILL AND THE PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED AND TAKE THEIR ROLLBOOK WITH THEM.

h) Following the bell signal, instruct STUDENTS to TAKE their PERSONAL BELONGINGS, LINE UP in twos IN the HALLWAY outside of room, REMAIN SILENT, and FOLLOW the TEACHER OUT of the BUILDING, THROUGH DESIGNATED EXIT.

The teacher should appoint a dependable i) student to make sure to close the door when everyone has vacated the room.

The TEACHER should LEAD the CLASS to the i) specified exit and down the stairwell to the street level doors. THE TEACHER MUST remains with the class and MAINTAIN ORDER.

You can find above our scores for the AP exams taken by the most students. LaGuardia AP students have excelled with the help of their devoted AP teachers. All should be proud of their accomplishments.

LaGuardia's AP results are among the best in New York City. In most cases, our AP scores are also better than the mean scores of students in New York State. Some of our impressive results follow: 92.37% of students taking the AP English Language and Composition Exam earned a 3 or above, and 63.56% earned a 4 or above; 83.97% of students taking the AP English Literature and Composition Exam earned a 4 or above, and 47.33% earned a grade of 3 or above; 78.38% of students taking the AP U.S. History Exam earned a 3 or above, and 49.19% earned a 4 or above; 81.53% of students taking the AP World History Exam earned a 3 or above, and 39.19% earned a 4 or above; 64% of students taking the AP Calculus AB Exam earned a 3 or above, and 42.22% earned a 4 or above; and 66.67% of students taking the AP Environmental Science Exam earned a 3 or above, and 45.61% earned a 4 or above. LaGuardia students took the AP World History Exam for the first time in 2012.

The Advanced Placement program (AP) allows students to pursue college level studies while still in high school. The AP Development Committee members represent a wide range of colleges and universities, including prestigious institutions. Students in AP classes experience a rigorous, college-level curriculum and have the chance to earn credit, placement, or both for college. Teachers who participate in AP professional development improve as teachers in general, not just as teachers of AP classes.
