Paper applications received after April 30, 2009, will be processed for the first check in September; however, employees may enroll, update and cancel their enrollment for EFT, Savings Bond, TSA and Metrocard through the DOE Payroll Portal at https://payrollportal.nycboe.net until close of business, May 15, 2009.

The enrollment deadline allows for the timely production of summer paychecks, which are due in early June.

EGG FILES TO BE SENT SOON




TEACHERS: The Tenth Time's a Charm: Submitting Your EGG File The second marking period ends on May
