TEXTBOOK COLLECTION



<u>TEACHERS: Please Review</u> <u>Textbook Collection Procedures.</u>

Textbook collection will take place with all AP classes on **Fri.**, **June 4**, and then by

department beginning Mon., June 7. Scanning will take place at one of four locations, which may vary by period. Please see your department supervisor regarding your assigned location for each class you teach.

You have two options for your students to return their textbooks in order to maximize instructional time on the date indicated for your department. Remember that students do not need ID cards to return textbooks.

- 1. The teacher can bring the class to the designated scanning site en-masse, the class is scanned, and everyone returns to class as a group.
- The teacher can send five students at a time to the designated scanning location. Students are scanned, return to class, and another group is released (preferred method).

If many teachers in your department choose option #1 and there are multiple classes during a given period, there will be less waiting time if your supervisor staggers arrivals every 10 minutes. Also, the first teacher to be scanned that period might wish to meet their class at the designated scanning site in order to speed the process along.

On Tue., June 8, students will receive a list of requested classes for Fall 2010. THIS IS NOT A SCHEDULE. Please check the classes we plan to give you for next semester. Keep in mind the following important facts:

- · All students must have lunch.
- No student may have more than ten periods, including lunch.
- Team Sports is considered a class and counts toward the ten period maximum.
- AP Biology and AP Chemistry are double-period sciences. Please count each accordingly.
- Be sure to properly count the mutli-period blocks for dance, drama, and technical theater.
- All twelfth-graders need one semester of Health unless they have previously taken the class.
- All students need Gym each semester with the exception of dance majors, drama majors, and tenth-twelfth grade technical theater majors.

ARTS TEACHERS: Take Advantage of This Grant Opportunity!

The Surdna Foundation is pleased to announce the eleventh round of the Surdna Arts
Teachers Fellowship Program, a national initiative to support the artistic revitalization of outstanding arts teachers. Eligible teachers can apply for grants of up to \$5,500 in support of artistic growth, with a complementary grant of \$1,500 provided to each Fellow's school for post-fellowship activities.
